

## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

## PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners,

For those old enough to remember “The Carol Burnett Show,” which from the 1960s to 1979, you will recall that episode ended with Carol Burnett crooning a farewell song and tugging her left earlobe. The song noted, “Seems we just get started and before you know it, comes the time we have to say, ‘So long.’” These words were followed by the aforementioned tugging of an earlobe, which was Burnett’s way of saying goodnight to her grandmother, and indeed to all her viewers.

**A Tug of the Ear.** This weekend we at Holy Cross and Immaculate Conception give a collective tug of the earlobe, as we bid a fond adieu and say “so, long” to our Parochial Vicar, Fr. John Solomon, as he brandishes his swim trunks, his innertube, and heads to the beach. Before you think Fr. Solomon is off to do a remake of “Beach Blanket Bingo,” let me clarify: he is going to his new assignment at St. Edmond’s Parish in Rehoboth Beach, Delaware. He is leaving here and getting there earlier than would be the case in most re-assignments, because the Diocese wants him settled-in before the lunatic Memorial Day (thru Labor Day) beach rush.

Fr. Solomon, our second priest in recent years educated in Rome (the first being Fr. McQuaide, from a few years ago), brought a grand knowledge of the Universal Church with him to our fair parishes in Dover and Marydel. He provided insightful meal time conversation at the rectory and shared a great love for the priesthood; moreover, he is dutiful in his Priestly ministry, and, for those not aware, exudes a love for basketball. I want to take this time to thank him for his service to us here in Dover and Marydel!

**Goodbye... for Now.** Holy Cross, these days, is like a crossroads. We are one of, I believe only two parishes, with three priests assigned, and with Parochial Vicars (i.e., Associate Pastors) at a premium, we are a prime source for priestly transfers in and out. But like most of our recent priests that moved on from here, many of them make their way back here for visits or keep in touch frequently. That can be said for Frs. Olson, McQuaide, Angeloni, and Giamello – all of whom I see and hear from with frequency. All of them talk about their time and experiences here at Holy Cross and Immaculate Conception... and I expect Fr. Solomon to join their ranks! So, for us, as priests move on, it’s never goodbye, it’s “I’ll see you in a few weeks.”

**Like the Marines...** On behalf of our two parishes, I want to wish Fr. Solomon the very best in his new assignment at St. Edmond’s Parish in Rehoboth; I am sure we will all be keeping him in our prayers. Relatedly, since much of the shifting of

priests from one assignment to another is at its heart a question of a shortage of vocations, I would commend all of you, as I am sure Fr. Solomon would, too, to continue to pray for, cultivate, and promote vocations to the Priesthood. (And if you are a young man – or not so young man – hearing God’s call to the Priesthood, speak to one of our parish priests... like the Marines, we need a few good men!).

**Confirmation.** On Saturday, May 12, 2018, Holy Cross and Immaculate Conception Parishes, in conjunction with St. Polycarp (Smyrna), St. Dennis (Galena) and St. John Parishes (Milford/Harrington), celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation, with our Bishop, here at Holy Cross Church. Confirmed were a very large number of young people, who filled our Church over two separate Ritual Masses of Confirmation. We congratulate these young men and women and commend them onward as fully initiated members of the Catholic Church and continue their pilgrimage of faith. I would ask that we keep these young people in our prayers as they continue their growth in faith in their lives which lay ahead of them.

**Shine and Rise!** This weekend our Church and Diocese observe the great high solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. This Holy Day, which is transferred from Thursday to Sunday in our Diocese, reminds us that as the Lord commends us to follow Him, he beckons us from the shining brilliance of Heaven, to which he returned 40 days after he rose from the dead (i.e., Easter). As Christ ascends back to the Father in the Heavenly kingdom, let us make it our hope, our joy, and our prayer, that we might follow Him, and share the joy of God’s love for an eternity. God bless all of you.
