

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend, some 74 young people from Holy Cross and Immaculate Conception Parishes received the Sacrament of Confirmation, administered by Bishop Malooly. We congratulate these young people on completing their Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist); they are now full members of the one, holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. With this in mind, I thought I would use this column as a refresher on the topic of Confirmation.

Chicago, Chicago. Way back when, the great rock band Chicago produced two high energy anthems that to this day remain two of my favorite songs; these two songs always serve as musical caffeine when I'm draggin' a little. They are both songs about strengthening. The first song is called "Alive Again," which states, "*All the empty yesterdays have disappeared / Now that you have filled my life with love / No one else could ever mean so much to me / Every day my high lasts longer / As our love grows ever stronger / Yesterday I would not have believed / That tomorrow the sun would shine / Then one day you came into my life / I am alive again I am alive again.*" This is an unintentional but beautiful expression of a young person experiencing God most profoundly in Confirmation. Because when we let the Holy Spirit, and his gifts, into our lives, indeed we are "Alive Again."

The other song is called "Feelin' Stronger Every Day." The chorus of the song notes, "*And knowing that you would have wanted it this way / I do believe I'm feelin' stronger every day.*" Like "Alive Again," this song reminds me of the empowerment of Confirmation as a Sacrament of strengthening; it provides access to God's grace so that the person who is confirmed can rightly find themselves "Feelin' Stronger Every Day," by the power of this Sacrament, always at work, and constantly renewed.

So, what is it about this Sacrament of Confirmation that finds us "feeling stronger" and feeling "alive again" after we receive it? What follows is some of what we should know in faith about this Sacrament.

What is Confirmation? Confirmation is the Sacrament that is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. Our Catechism states that "*by the sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence, they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.*"

Sealing the Deal. In the pivotal moment of the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Bishop anoints the crown of the head of the one to be confirmed with Sacred Chrism (a consecrated holy oil). As he anoints the candidate, he says, "*Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.*" Okay, let's flashback to Baptism: an infant who was baptized was likewise anointed on the head with the same Sacred Chrism. Think of the application of this holy oil in terms of paint: When you have to paint a wall, you first put on a primer coat, then you put on the second coat to seal it in. In Baptism, a child receives the Holy Spirit and the Chrism is applied for the first time; in Confirmation, a second-coat (if you will allow the analogy) of Chrism is applied – sealing and completing the baptismal graces. In some manner it may be observed that Confirmation is a form of completing the

Sacrament of Baptism. And like Baptism, Confirmation is received only once, as it imprints an indelible spiritual mark on the soul, marking that person as eternally belonging to Christ.

What's the matter? What is necessary for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation? Catholic teaching tells us that Sacraments require specific "form and matter" to be present in order that they be in fact effected. In order for the Sacrament of Confirmation to be properly effected, the "matter" that must be present is a baptized un-confirmed person and Sacred Chrism; the "form" of the Sacrament is the proper minister saying the words *Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit* as the Sacred Chrism is applied.

That's the Spirit! What are the effects of this Sacrament of Confirmation? Upon being Confirmed, the Holy Spirit goes "all Santa" on a person; he drops off a whole bunch of presents (gifts)! Known as the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, these are traditionally identified as:

- Wisdom - the gift that allows one to comprehend, more fully, the truths of faith
- Understanding - the gift that allows one to appreciate creation in relation to God; hence one can see Christ in his fellow man
- Counsel – the gift that allows one to make right judgment (i.e., when you judge someone or something, judge well and rightly).
- Fortitude – the gift of moral courage to do God's will, even in the face of adversity
- Knowledge – the gift of awareness and comprehension of God
- Piety – the gift of awareness of the need to worship and love God
- Fear of the Lord – the gift of being aware that God is always aware of all that we do

Juicy Fruits! Now, as would be the case with any gifts we receive, we have to open them and use them to get their benefits. If you treat these gifts of the Holy Spirit like a 10-year old treats the gifts of a pair of socks at Christmas (e.g., toss them aside and look for something else in the gift pile), then you may fail to get the benefit of what God has given you. If you do put these gifts to use, they will bear fruit. What fruits? What the Church calls the fruits of the Holy Spirit: Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Benignity, Goodness, Long-suffering (patient suffering), Mildness, Faith, Modesty, Continence (self-control), and Chastity.

And so, with the grace, gifts and fruits of this Sacrament in mind, let us commit ourselves to pray for our newly confirmed young men and women that the strengthening power of this Sacrament allows them to abide in their Catholic faith. Just as the Holy Spirit fills them, let Him also fill us! Let us always be mindful to allow the Holy Spirit to work within us, leaving us feeling stronger every day, and alive again in faith, at every moment in our lives – helping us to bear good witness to the name Christian.

SCHOOL UPDATE

*“God is a good God, oh yes, He is!

I'm not absolutely certain when I say this, but I'd almost be willing to bet that this song could easily be called the banner theme for Pre-K. Our adorable four year olds, (although some are super quick to remind us that **“I'm five now”**) learn this song early on each school year. Mrs. McGowan, Mrs. Wegemer, and Mrs Zappulo teach them the body movements that make the song all the more fun to sing. Bishop Malooly is always entertained when the children sing for him. Their grandparents, and parents all look upon their precious little one with great delight when the clapping and singing commence regaling the goodness of our God.

Last week we celebrated our Mothers. In Pre-K we celebrated by having Muffins for Moms. Everyone gathered in the Parish Hall for a great celebration of song, presentation of gifts, and mmmuffins! I was sitting at a table where Moms received a beautiful statue of the BVM known as Our Lady of the Broom. Simply done, the child constructed the statue from a spool from a roll of paper towels, a small styrofoam ball for her head, a lovely piece of blue material for the dress and veil, and a small broom! Affixed to a paper plate base is the lovely statue. Mom also received a cookbook of each child's favorite recipes. Chief among the favorites ranked mac and cheese, spaghetti, and pizza!

- **Prenatal Development at Month 5:** You may begin to feel your baby move, since he or she is developing muscles and exercising them. This first movement is called quickening. Hair begins to grow on baby's head. Your baby's shoulders, back, and temples are covered by a soft fine hair called lanugo. This hair protects your baby and is usually shed at the end of the baby's first week of life.
- The baby's skin is covered with a whitish coating called vernix caseosa. This "cheesy" substance is thought to protect baby's skin from the long exposure to the amniotic fluid. This coating is shed just before birth.
- By the end of the fifth month, your baby is about 10 inches long and weighs from 1/2 to 1 pound.
