

## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

Like the high school student who fails to study for his history class, if he doesn't learn and remember his history he is doomed to repeat it! Not wishing that doom on anyone, this week's column is dedicated to some historical remembrances and words of the forefathers of our nation, as they related to the Lord, to religious liberty and to the religious identity of these United States.

This past week our nation observed Independence Day for the 242nd time; on this national holiday we remember our nations forefathers signing and promulgating the Declaration of Independence. And what exactly did that document put forth that made it so memorable and worthy of celebrating? Well, a vast portion of it is a delineation of specific complaints against the British crown, however, the opening paragraphs contextualize the desire for independence within the context of an understanding of the place of God in our world.

Life! Most pointedly, the second paragraph says, in part, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." It goes on, "That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it." Hence, the Revolutionary War was well, revolutionary, as it was fought not to merely replace one government with another, but to seek a government that affirms a right to life, a right to liberty and a right to pursue happiness. Further, it made clear, that these rights were not of the political sort, but rather given us by God (the Creator), and unalienable.

**Good Company.** The connection to God cited in the Declaration of Independence was not some one-off a-ha moment of religious reflection, but rather represented a developed view of the value of God and faith in this "new world." In 1609, the Virginia Company which forged the Jamestown Colony published a pamphlet called "The Purposes and Ends of the Plantation Begun in Virginia." That pamphlet cited the main objective of the colony was "to preach and baptize" people by the "propagation of the Gospel... to add to the treasury of Heaven."

**Thank God!** Let us fast-forward to 1620, the Pilgrim settlers fleeing religious persecution in Europe, notably in Anglican England but also in Holland, forged "The Mayflower Compact," which put forth that the purpose of their foray into this new unknown land was "for the Glory of God and the advancement of the Christian faith." A year later, amidst difficulties and hardships, they set aside a day to give Thanksgiving to God for his blessings.

**The Rhode Less Travelled.** In 1636, Roger Williams founded the Providence Plantations (modern day Rhode Island), so named by Williams to honor God's abiding presence with the new comers to this new land. He wrote that religious liberty was to be understood "as a natural right." This idea of religious liberty was further affirmed in Maryland's 1649's Religious Toleration Act which, recognizing the varying flavors of Christianity living in the same areas and anticipating disagreement, stated: "no person professing to believe in Jesus Christ shall from henceforth be any wise troubled... in respect of, his or her religion, nor in the free exercise thereof within this province." Further it posited that no

one could be "compelled to the beliefs or exercise of any other religion against his or her consent."

**Penn's State.** In Pennsylvania, founder William Penn, took a similar stance, saying that no one who believed in "Almighty God... Creator, Upholder, and Ruler of the World," should face any persecution by the Government. Penn held that this would make Pennsylvania prosper (and it did), because "God will bless us and make it the seed of a nation." And with the exception of the outlandishly high tolls on the Pennsylvania Turnpike, Penn forged a pretty good state!

**A Caveat.** Religious liberty took a slight detour in the late 18th century, when in many state constitutions a defined belief in God as a requirement for public office. In Delaware, the most specific requirement of all the states was found, as, to hold public office, a man would have to make "a profession of faith in God, the Father, Jesus Christ his only son, and the Holy Ghost, one God, blessed for evermore." As states made more and more requirements, Catholics found themselves locked out of public life, but soon most of these requirements fell from favor. Of note, eight states today do require belief in a supreme being (not a specific religious test, but that of belief that there is a God): Pennsylvania, Maryland, Arkansas, North Carolina, South Carolina, Texas, Tennessee and Mississippi.

**Who's on First.** In 1791, the view dating back to Jamestown, the Mayflower Compact, Roger Williams and William Penn, found expression in the adoption of the First Amendment to our United States Constitution, which stated in part, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof..." And so, religious liberty was enshrined in the governing document of our nation – and nation born of the Declaration of Independence, a document for which we just celebrated its signing.

**God and Country.** So, we have a nation born of a belief in God – core to the American experience – and defining three specific rights as unalienable: the right to life, the right to liberty and the right to property. But, though they are unalienable, let us never take those rights for granted, for they are constantly under attack, at home and abroad. And please remember that our nation is not neutral about God; our forefathers, our Declaration of Independence, our Constitution, and our Presidents from Washington, through history and to the present day, all invoke the name of God. He is the fabric of our nation, he is our protector, and we should be wary about losing sight of Him, as a nation.

**GBA!** Patrick Henry, American Patriot and Statesman, famously wrote, "It is when people forget God, that tyrants forge their chains." More pointedly, Governor William Bradford, who led the Plymouth Colony from 1621-1657, cautioned us: "What our fathers, with so much difficulty, attained, do not basely relinquish. This week on which we celebrated the Independence of the United States of America, let us pray that we never forget our dependence on God – either individually or as a nation. God bless America!


### Congratulations Class of 2018!

\$1.58 million was accepted.



- **Si es católico y tiene un matrimonio anterior en la Iglesia Católica (o está casado con el permiso de la Iglesia en otra Iglesia cristiana):** En esta circunstancia, es posible que necesite una nulidad. Una nulidad se refiere a la cuestión de si un matrimonio fue contractado válidamente en el momento del consentimiento (es decir, hubo coacción, hubo impedimentos, etc.). Si se considera que las circunstancias del día del matrimonio no fueron las adecuadas o que se impidió el consentimiento informado, se puede emitir una nulidad que lo libere para que se case. La buena noticia es que ese proceso, con las enmiendas presentadas por los Papas Benedicto XVI y, más recientemente, por el Papa Francisco, se ha vuelto mucho más rápido (por lo general, unos seis meses o menos).
