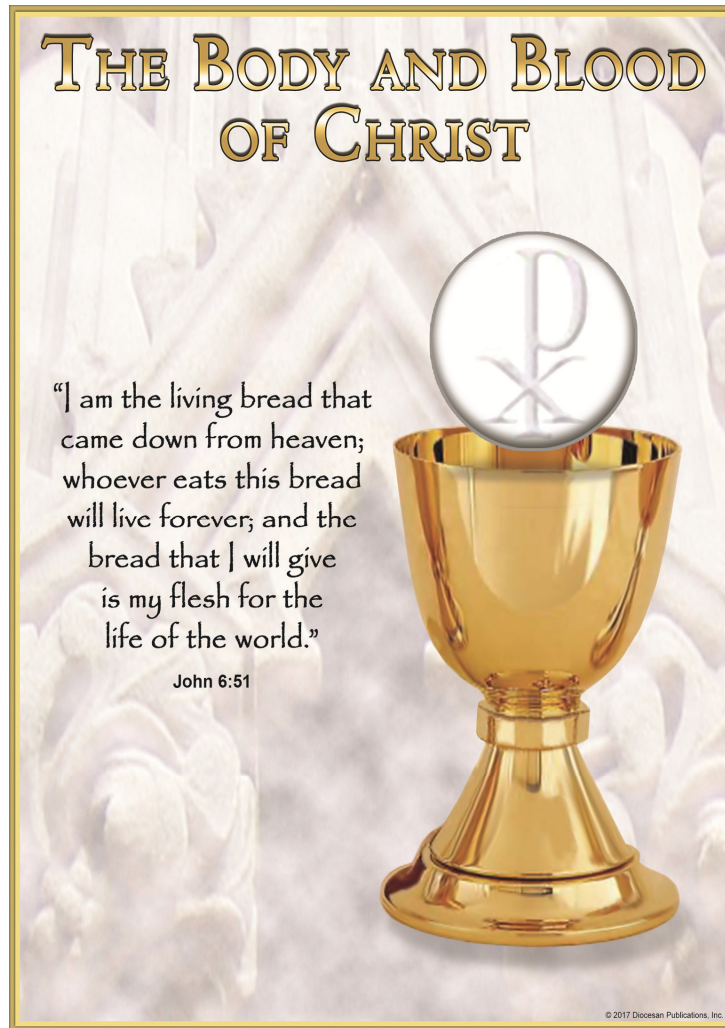

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

Go West Young Priest. As most of you are already aware, Fr. Michael Angeloni is scheduled to leave our two parishes on June 28. Sad doesn't begin to express my sorrow at seeing him depart. In my book, he is a Priest's Priest. For me he has been a good friend, a good listener, and a good voice of experience for me. He will be missed by the parish collectively but especially by his brother priests. We all wish Fr. Angeloni well as he hitches up the wagon train and heads west to Easton, where he will serve as a Parochial Vicar at Ss. Peter and Paul. Next week, I will have Fr. Angeloni take over the Pastor's Column space in the bulletin, and he will address us all with his letter of farewell.

A Shameful Law. Last week, the Delaware Legislature passed into law what I can only describe as the most radical, permissive law in the history of our nation, on the matter of abortion. The bill as passed effectively eliminates almost all regulations and restrictions on abortion. While originally purported to do nothing more than keep the status quo on abortion, relative to what is currently the practice, that turned out not to be the case. It seems the bill's sponsors instead slipped in language that eliminates even the most common abortion regulations, such as parental involvement for minors, informed consent, and restrictions on abortions once unborn babies are viable outside the womb. Specifically, it eliminates abortion regulations, such as parental involvement for minors; informed consent before abortion; and restrictions on abortions once unborn babies are viable outside the womb. It would allow abortion to take place in the third trimester, up until the moment of birth, so long as the doctor deems that there is the risk of health of the mother (defined as: physical health, mental health, emotional health and familial health). Thus, the doctor being paid to perform the abortion, can be the same person who makes the health decision. It also snuffs out government oversight of abortion facilities.

This bill passed our 20 seat State Senate with a bare majority of 11 votes, it passed in the House on 22-16 vote and was quickly and shockingly signed into law by our Governor, John Carney. Thus, Delaware is now the state with the most permissive abortion law in these United States. It is a shameful outrage. We need to pray for and speak to our lawmakers to move them to have a change of heart and of mind on this matter. About 4,000 human hearts are stopped annually in Delaware by abortion, the last thing we need is a law to make it easier to stop those hearts.

Corpus Christi. The Thursday after Trinity Sunday is set aside on the Church Calendar as the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, commonly called "Corpus Christi" (yes, like the name of the city in Texas). In the United States, the celebration of that holy day is transferred to the Sunday after

Trinity Sunday (this past Sunday). Now, what we celebrate on the day, as we celebrate at every Mass, is the Sacrament of the Eucharist (Holy Communion), but more specifically we celebrate a special moment in Church history: Here's the story!

In 1263 a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass, while on a pilgrimage. He was suffering difficulties in his faith in believing that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. During his celebration of the Mass, as Fr. Peter said the words of Consecration blood began to flow out of the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands and onto the altar and its linens. After the initial shock of Fr. Peter and the parishioners, he interrupted the Mass, locked up the Church and sought to speak to Pope Urban IV who was in a nearby town. On getting the news from multiple witness, the Pope then sent emissaries (i.e., like a team from CSI Vatican) to investigate. When all the facts were ascertained, a miracle was declared, and the still bloodied host and linen cloth taken in procession to the Pope, who had the relics placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, where they are still present today.

One year later, in 1264, Pope Urban IV instituted the feast of Corpus Christi, a special feast day to recognize and to promote the great gift of the Blessed Sacrament. He commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose a Mass and prayers honoring the Holy Eucharist. In his effort, he composed the Eucharistic hymns "Panis Angelicus," "Pange Lingua," "O Salutaris Hostia" and "Tantum Ergo."

In August 1964 (700th anniversary of the feast of Corpus Christi), Pope Paul VI celebrated Mass at the altar where those sacred relics are kept in a golden shrine in the Cathedral of Orvieto. In 1976, he visited Bolsena; from there he spoke via television to the attendees of the 41st International Eucharistic Congress in Philadelphia; he spoke of the Holy Eucharist as being "... a mystery great and inexhaustible."

It is the historical events of 1263, and that inexhaustible mystery of the Holy Eucharist, that we celebrate this weekend on this Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. *(On a Fr. Lentini note of trivia: The Solemnity of Corpus Christi — observed on its original Thursday date— is a national holiday in Austria, Brazil, Bolivia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Colombia, Croatia, Dominican Republic, Haiti, East Timor, Germany, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Panama, Peru, Poland, Portugal, San Marino, Spain, Switzerland, Grenada, Saint Lucia, and Trinidad and Tobago.)*

A joyful solemnity of Corpus Christi to all of you!

SCHOOL UPDATE

It was a hot August morning as I made my way from home to the Canton area of Baltimore City. An area of town I vowed never to work in because of its reputation for the “tough kids.” I was fresh out of college and was on my way to my second job interview for a teaching position. My first interview was in a Catholic school about five minutes away from my house. I was not selected for the position at Resurrection School. And so began my lifelong penchant for never working close to where I lived. My grandfather was getting a little bit antsy, to say the least because I had not only graduated with my degree, but I also graduated with college loan debt. I clearly remember our professors telling us that the job market was tight and no one was hiring teachers. But we did our due diligence and put applications in all over the place. I, myself only wanted to teach in a Catholic school. As I said earlier, my first interview didn’t work out so well so in mid-July or so my antsy grandfather wrangled an interview with an insurance salesman friend of his. I humored him by going, but I assured him I couldn’t sell ice water in the desert. His response...“You have to do something.” I got that job, believe it or not. I was even going to have my own secretary. And, I admit, it was tempting. The only thing was I didn’t know a single thing about selling insurance. Yes, there was the training etc. but beyond the secretary part, I didn’t have a bit of interest.


And so, we waited, I enrolled in the training sessions. It was August before I knew it and all I knew was that I had degree that wasn’t doing me any good. It was three days before the onset of the school year. It was pretty discouraging. God had a plan for me, but I was on my timeline, not his. I needed a job and I needed it soon. RRRRinggggg! RRRRingggg!! “Hello.” “Good afternoon, my name is Sister Clementine. Is this Linda?” “I am calling to inquire if you have a job for this school year.” My appointment was set for the next day. I was a wreck as I made my way through downtown. Unfamiliar with the area, (except by reputation...the tough kids...) I left plenty of time to find the place. Pulling up in front of the convent, I noted the front door was open in anticipation of my arrival. We exchanged pleasantries quickly as Sister shuffled me off to the room where the coffee table was set up with my contract, insurance forms, and various other forms waiting for me to sign. All she knew about me was my name! (and that I was punctual) She needed a teacher, and I needed a job. Beyond that, nothing else was important. My “interview” lasted less than ten minutes. I couldn’t wait to tell my grandfather.

That was the way my career began. Teaching in a part of the city with a bad reputation, where I said I’d never work, in a Catholic school that had about 200 students, in a building that was in a serious state of disrepair. Sister showed me to my classroom after I signed all the forms. She gave me my keys and told me to be ready in three days. They were some long days as my mother and I feverishly prepared materials. I was given a seventh grade homeroom. I spent seven wonderful years in Canton teaching some of the best kids I ever met.

It’s been a bittersweet week for me. Holy Cross bid a fond and loving farewell to two dedicated educators this past week. Between the two of them, Mrs. Susan McMullen and Mrs. Mary Wojtkiewicz have a little less than fifty years of experience laying rock solid foundation for their pre-k, kindergarten and first grade students. As of this reading, I imagine Mrs. “Wojo” is off somewhere enjoying her new life as a happy camper and cross-stitcher, traveling up and down the east coast in search of lighthouses. Mrs. McMullen is staying local and is looking forward to her new career as a substitute teacher right here at HC. We look forward to that, too.

By way of a brief introduction I’d like to inform everyone that Mrs. Ann Rider, a lifelong parishioner of Holy Cross and mother of two HC graduates will be teaching Kindergarten, and another lifelong parishioner, Mrs. Deborah Borden will be teaching first grade. I am also excited about introducing Mrs. Rosanna Maddalena Zappulo who will be teaching our third section of Pre-K. Mrs. Zappulo is a HC parishioner and graduate of Holy Cross School. I love it when they come back home!!! You can be sure that I will have plenty to tell you about these three ladies in the future, but one thing I can tell you right now is that they are happy to be teaching at Holy Cross School. Can you blame them??

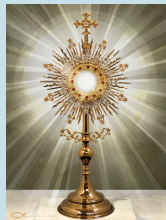
