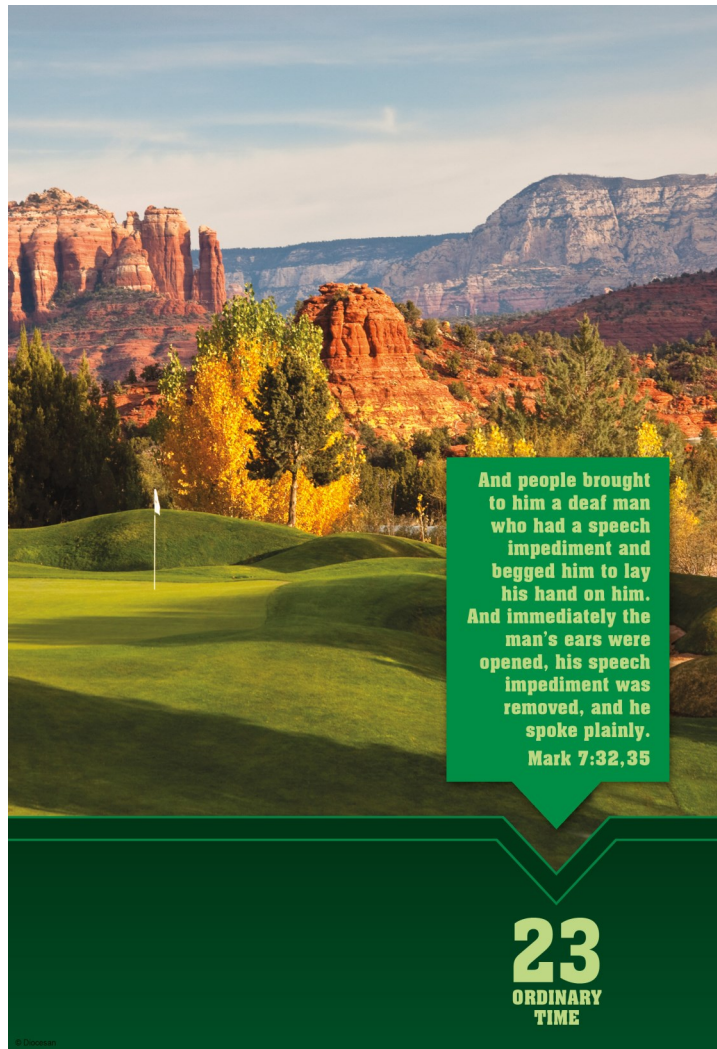

## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

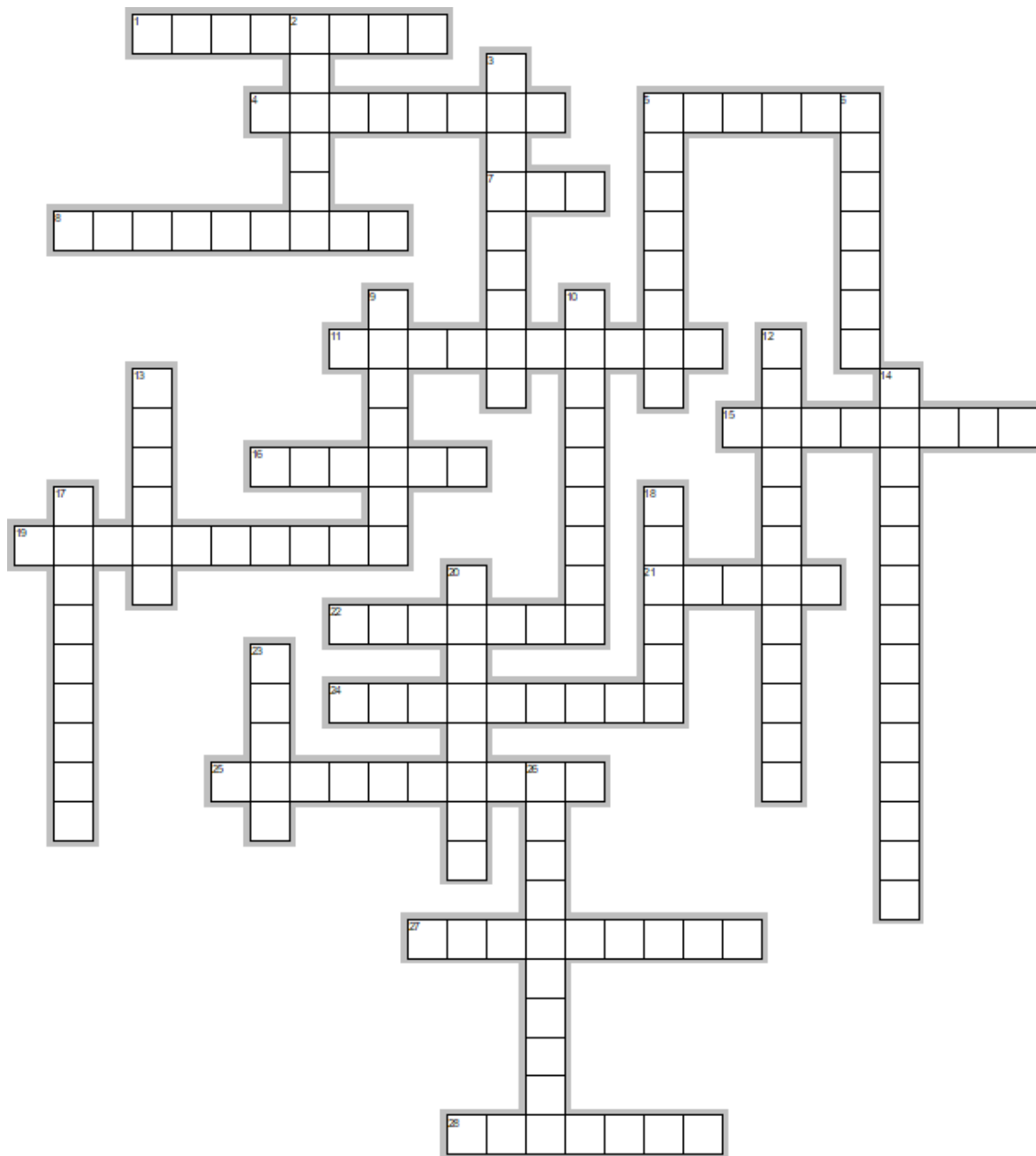
Dear Parishioners,

## SCHOOL UPDATE

Over the past several years we have always enjoyed celebrating our annual Diocesan theme. You will find its presence throughout the school buildings. This year our theme is "Rejoice in the Lord." We all rejoiced when the students came walking down the classroom hallways with an eagerness to see their new teachers, their friends, and their new classroom.

As we rejoice in the Lord, with each new month we will focus on one of the Ten Commandments as well as on a different virtue. God gave Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai to serve as principles of moral behavior for all of humanity. Appropriately, the Ten Commandments of God are the very foundation of the moral code and legal system of justice. In the Catholic faith, the Ten Commandments are considered divine law because God himself revealed them, leaving no room for doubt or uncertainty. As we rejoice in the Lord, with each new month we will focus on one of the Ten Commandments as well as on a different specified virtue.

In the world in which we live it is difficult, to say the very least to concentrate on the virtuous life with all of the entrapments that surround our daily routine. Take for example, on any given day, when a prospective family comes in to discuss enrollment at Holy Cross, it is almost a given that should there be a younger sibling in attendance he will be entertained by the electronic device provided by mom and dad. The electronic device is used to guarantee a somewhat peaceful and productive conversation between adults.

I may have relayed this story in a previous edition of our newsletter, but permit me to recount an experience I had with a prospective family in my office. I will never forget this family. There were four children, along with mom and dad who literally took up every square inch of my office space once we got the baby carriage in. The three school age children sat at the table. Mom and dad stood alongside the stroller. Mom and dad began with their dissatisfaction with the local school system. I then began our discussion on the numerous benefits of a Catholic education. All the while the children sat quietly. I was pleased when they made their decision to transfer their children to Holy Cross and began working at the computer to schedule screening times convenient and conducive to their schedule. As I sat at my desk, I heard the children whispering between themselves, ever so quietly. Soon it became apparent that these children were not having a conversation between themselves. They were praying the Rosary! I was amazed. I can assure you that this was a first for me! And....sadly, it has never happened again. Clearly, here was a family who was raising their children in a fashion that speaks to placing God at the forefront, right where God belongs! Mom and dad never prompted these children to start praying. The oldest lead the prayer and the two younger ones responded in unison. It was a beautiful sight to behold.
