

## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

Remember TV's "Charlie's Angels?" The "Angels" played by Kate Jackson (Sabrina), Jaclyn Smith (Kelly) and Farrah Fawcett-Majors (Jill) were detective helpers of Charlie Townsend (a character only heard but never seen in the series). Charlie would send his "Angels" on various missions to help out folks in trouble. These gun-toting, gladiatrices of law and order always triumphed over evil – and did so while dressed in some of the finest fashions of the 70s.

This classic TV show, which aired amidst the hideous powder blue leisure suits and garish wide ties of the 70s, was about fictional angels. Coming up, we are celebrating the real deal angels! Saturday, September 29 marks the Feast of the Archangels and on October 2, we will celebrate our Guardian Angels. These feasts celebrate two types of angels, but there are others! Specifically, there are nine ranks or choirs of angels – each with a different purpose as created by God. Let's examine these angels in their proper "order," keeping in mind that angels are ranked, so to speak, highest to lowest, based on their understood proximity to God -- and they are grouped in threes:

### Group 1: Angels of the Heavenly Court

1. **Seraphim.** The Seraphim are, as the 1960s song might put it, the leaders of the packs. These angels are the guardians that are astride God's holy throne in heaven. At Mass when we say "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts" we are imitating the words which the Seraphim use to praise God around his holy throne (see Isaiah 6:1-7). According to Scripture, Seraphim have six wings (two cover their face, two cover their feet and two are for flying).
2. **Cherubim.** The Cherubim (a.k.a. Cherubs) are the second of the nine choirs of angels. Most people don't like being called two-faced but imagine having four faces! The Cherubim do... they have the faces of a man, an ox, a lion and an eagle. While the Seraphim have six wings, the Cherubim only have four, but their wings are also covered with eyes. In Genesis, the Cherubim guarded the way to the tree of life. They also stood guard as heavenly attendants to God, endlessly praising Him.
3. **Thrones.** The Thrones are like the gateway to see the Big Guy... no lower ranked angel (#4-9) gets to stand before God, unless the Thrones – doing the will of God – let them in. The Thrones and some of the lower angel choirs are referenced in Colossians 1:16, "For in Him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through Him and for Him." These references, which many might take to be earthly political descriptions, are actually references to types of angels.

### Group 2: Angels Governing the Heavens

1. **Dominions.** These are ones who give the orders to the angels in the ranks #5-9. They make known God's will for the angels beneath them. To use a postal metaphor, they are the regional postal sorting office which delivers all the letters to each local post office in its jurisdiction for delivery. Thus, when the priest invokes in prayer "Thrones"

and "Dominions" – he is referring to the angels that spread the words of our prayers to the other angels (Dominions), and the angels that let those words into the heavenly sanctuary (Thrones).

2. **Virtues.** The name of these angels, "virtues" is translated as an alternate way of expressing a Greek word meaning "strength." The Virtues carry God's messages and commands to the seasons, the stars, the sun, etc. To us humans, these angels carry God's message and call to virtue, and make known to us the miracles of God in the world.
3. **Powers.** These are God's shock troops – these are the warrior angels; they are sometimes called "Potentates" (like the word we use for one who exercises great political or military power). They fight against the powers of darkness and evil that attempt to corrupt mankind and our world (and indeed our universe). In the cosmic battle between good and evil, the Powers are God's Green Berets.

### Group 3: Angels Governing the Earth

1. **Principalities.** This is an odd group of angels. You see, tradition says they are hostile to God. Why? Because of mankind's multitude of sins which God has forgiven. Though hostile, they are unlike Lucifer, as they did not rebel against God because they realized that there is but one God and he must be obeyed – if not out of pure love, then out of obligation and truth. The Principalities send a good message to us: Even when we can't make sense of God's plan for us, we must remain faithful. What do they do? They bring God's messages of inspiration in the arts and science – they are the lighters of the way to knowledge. The Principalities unveil, by the grace of God, the mysteries of the world and universe. Are you educated? Well that is because you listened to God's message brought via the Principalities.
2. **Archangels.** What?! Why are Archangels so low on the list? These are the ones who helped many folks in the Bible – these are the rock stars of the world of angels, no? Well, no. Remember the angelic rankings are based on closeness to God vs. closeness to man/earth. The Archangels – like Michael (who fought Satan in the Book of Revelation), Raphael (who healed Tobit), and Gabriel (who brought God's message to Mary) – are close to us, in the celestial sense. To use a baseball movie metaphor, these are "The Angels in the Infield." They have a special role to mankind at critical moments in salvation history – these are key angels "for us men, and for our salvation." There are seven archangels according to scripture.
3. **Angels.** These are, in part, our Guardian Angels. They are closest to the material world. They bring God's messages of guidance, truth, and grace to each of us. We can listen to those messages or not. The Angels hope we listen, and they never stop bringing God's messages to us.

Creation is blessed with men and angels: distinct creations of God. As God's children, we are blessed to have the aid of His angels -- His messengers – to guide us every moment of our lives. Praise God!

## SCHOOL UPDATE

No matter the age, no matter the lifestyle, no matter one's station in life; I believe we should all have goals and objectives. There should always be something to drive towards, motivation to swing the legs over the side of the bed each morning...no matter the age. Perhaps you may have seen the popular movie *The Bucket List*. A billionaire played by actor Jack Nicholson and a car mechanic played by actor Morgan Freeman are complete strangers, until fate lands them in the same hospital room. The men find they have two things in common: a need to come to terms with who they are and what they have done with their lives, and a desire to complete a list of things they want to see and do before they die. Against their doctor's advice, the men leave the hospital and set out on the adventure of a lifetime.

Goals and objectives are difficult to distinguish, one from the other. . In fact, we often use the two terms interchangeably. However, there is a subtle difference. But knowing the difference can help us to use both in a constructive way, to get us from where we are to where we want to go. Ahh! There you have it!! Where is that we want to go??

The major similarity between goals and objectives is that the both involve *forward motion*, but accomplish it in very different ways. We can think of goals as being the Big Picture — where we hope that our efforts will ultimately bring us. Objectives are about a specific plan of attack — usually a series of them — each being relatively short-term in nature.

Now that we know the difference, allow me to expound briefly on G/O for HCS. We are a great school, beyond a shadow of a doubt, a HC student is indeed blessed to have the teachers to guide and instruct their learning, to guide them to effective methods for organization and instilling a moral foundation.

This leads me to revealing on of our long range goals. I believe with my whole heart that HCS has all the qualifications of a National Blue Ribbon School.
