

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

For those who read this column regularly, you'll know that I enjoy plopping in pop culture reference left and right throughout these pieces. Whether they are TV based, comic related, theatrical or musical, they will be found scattered about my writings like falsetto notes on a Bee Gees records or redneck jokes in an Ernest movie (you see, there I go again). As you read on, you will likely hit a few of those type of references, however this column is not just going to have some cultural references from movies, but rather it will actually be about two upcoming movies that I am keen write about during this Respect Life Month.

Previews of Coming Attractions. Amidst advertisements for the latest "Halloween" movie, the latest "Fantastic Beasts" installment or the "Johnny English Strikes Again" sequel (I'll be seeing that one), there are two important movies that have slipped under the radar (or rather, if were to critique the media, purposely taken off the radar). Later this coming week -- and then later this coming year -- two immensely important pro-life movies will hit theatres. The first is called "Gosnell," (opening October 12, at the Dover Mall Theatre), while the second is "Roe vs Wade: The Untold Story" (expected to hit theatres in early 2019).

Superman to the Rescue. Up, up and way, Superman actor, Dean Cain, leads the cast of "Gosnell," a movie that tells the story of the actions, police investigation, trial, of 2013 conviction of Philadelphia abortionist Dr. Kermit Gosnell -- a man who has been dubbed the "biggest serial killer in America." This true story begins with a Philadelphia police detective, played by Dean Cain, initially searching for illegal drugs at an abortion clinic, but ultimately uncovering the bodies of babies stored in orange juice containers and bags in the clinic's lunchroom refrigerator.

Murder Most Foul. With these findings, the case moves from a drug investigation into a potential murder case. As the facts are uncovered, it is clear that Dr. Gosnell stepped beyond even the horrendous, but legal, acts of abortion. It seems that he took babies born alive, severed their spines with scissors and left them to die. Gosnell was charged with their murders, as well as the murder of a patient. Spoiler alert: Gosnell would go on to be found guilty of first degree murder of these "born alive" infants, and in the death of one adult patient. He was also convicted of 21 felony counts of illegal late-term abortion, and 211 counts of violating the 24-hour informed consent law. He was sentenced to life in prison without chance of parole.

Caught on Film. The movie is a powerful retelling of events from our own local area headlines just a few years ago and presents a pointed critique and observation of this morality play that regards the ramification of the culture of death. I would commend all to see this film, and the story it captures. As a powerful reminder of the slippery slope down which legalized abortion leads a society.

"Roe vs. Wade" – The Movie. In early 2019, expect to see the movie Roe vs. Wade hit big screen nationally; it tells the

story of the landmark, infamous, Roe vs. Wade decision which legalized abortion in the U.S. Academy Award winning actor Jon Voight leads a coterie of well-known stars in this feature film.

Of Norma and Jane. The film begins with a woman named Margaret Sanger, a eugenicist who sought to reduce the reproduction of those who were deemed "unfit." The de facto founder of Planned Parenthood, Sanger rallied many to her cause, which began what would grow into a movement to legalize abortion (of which Planned Parenthood is, today, the largest provider). In 1969, folks in the movement to legalize abortion, took a poor girl with a 10th grade education named Norma McCorvey (now famously known as "Jane Roe") and persuaded her that she could attain an abortion if she sued the government. Thus, with the help of the abortion lobby, she sued Henry Wade, the district attorney of Dallas County and the case "Roe v. Wade" was born. This movie follows the case through the legal system, and all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court. This courtroom drama is a story that needs to be told, and its ramifications need to be understood.

The Price of Forgetting. These two movies, "Gosnell" and "Roe vs Wade" are important films that tell stories that must be told and must be heard. As Catholics, we understand that human life is a gift from God that must be protected; these movies tell the story of what happens when humanity forgets that. The Spider-Man movies of past 20 years taught the lesson (over and over again) that "with great power comes great responsibility." Humanity, governments and individuals have a great responsibility to protect human life, and we have to use well the power of free will rightly, to meet that responsibility. We need to be super-heroes to the unborn!

Macs, PCs, Conversions. A few years ago, I had a great conversion. I switched from Mac to PC. My Mac friends still curse me for that decision. While that change was a minor one in the grand scheme of life, there are conversions that can be serious business. In serious matters, a conversion takes on the value of great witness. On matters of – literally -- life and death, they carry the greatest of witness value to other. Over the years there have been many conversions to the Pro-Life movement, but none bigger than that Norma McCorvey (Jane Roe) herself. Hearing the Pro-life message, caused her to have a great conversion later in life; she became staunch pro-life advocate and converted to Catholicism. In February 2005, McCorvey petitioned the Supreme Court, as an original litigant, to overturn the Roe v. Wade decision, but her petition was denied. McCorvey passed away in 2017, a devoted Pro-Life Catholic!

Movies and media have great sway on people's minds and hearts – whether they should or not is a topic for another column. As such, I hope these films strengthen the faith of those who already value the gift of life and its protection and sway the hearts and minds of those who don't.
