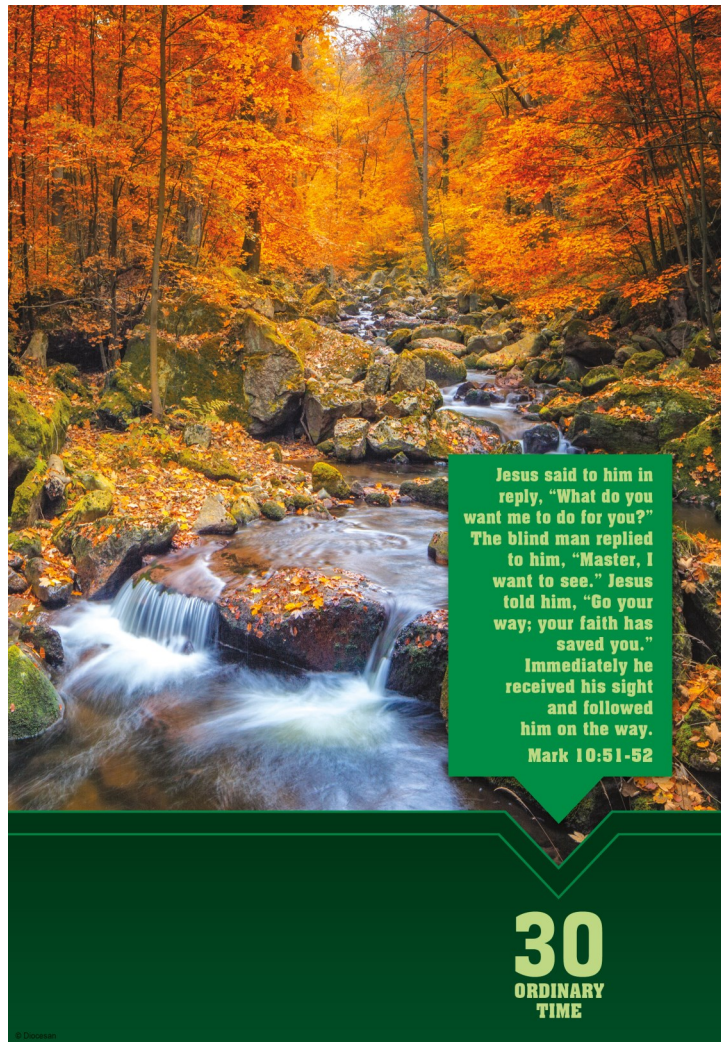

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

I've turned over my column this weekend to Mrs. Pollitt, our school principal, since I was away on retreat. Fr. Lentini

Over the past three weeks, some of our most faithful readers may have detected a common denominator (if you will) throughout those installments. Since the beginning of the school year I have been profoundly and acutely aware of the contributions to our school community made by those I have affectionately referred to as our unsung heroes. HCS would not have the spirit, the kinship, and the unity without the devotion of our unsung heroes...in a name; our HSA moms, and our volunteer moms and dads who devote so much of their personal time for the well-being of our school.

Commitment: the thesaurus offers over a dozen synonyms for the word. The dictionary offers no less than six definitions, not a single one of which includes in the body of the definition the term "heart." In my opinion, no one can truly make a commitment without heartfelt loyalty. Perhaps I'm just looking through my rose-colored glasses again, but I firmly believe that HCS is comprised of a community of people who believe in the values of a Catholic education, they are of the strong opinion that a Catholic education will prepare their children in a manner that no other institution can. Permit me to quote one of our moms (a HCS graduate) who told me that "I get such a good feeling every day when I walk in to drop my kids off in the morning."

Commitment: There are currently at least fifty one children who are enrolled in our school who have parents who are graduates of Holy Cross. Seventy five percent; or thirty eight of those fifty one children have parents who have graduated from Holy Cross during the time that I have been privileged to serve our school. It is always my greatest and true pleasure when, during the Open House events at the beginning of the school year I see the number of those who have returned to their educational roots; having made the decision to gift their children with the same positive experience their parents blessed them with when they were students at HCS. I spoke with a mom of a three year old last week. She told me that she made sure her husband understood that when the time came to enroll their daughter in a school that Holy Cross would be the *only* consideration. Mom did not graduate from HC, but attended through fifth grade and remembers fondly her years as a Catholic school student. Additionally, we have a young man in second grade and a young man in eighth grade who are third generation HCS students! These two young men have grandparents and parents who graduated from Holy Cross Schools. That's commitment to the great ideals of Catholic education!

Commitment: Let's shift our focus slightly and direct our attention upon those who have responded to God's call. I refer to those men and women who have dedicated their professional lives to educating children in a Catholic school. More specifically, to those men and women who have answered God's call to serve Holy Cross School students, those men and women who I have the privilege to work alongside of on a daily basis. For me, it is indeed a blessing. Working alongside the faculty members of our school in the day to day as we address children's learning needs, discuss ways to enhance curriculum, plan events, research a new and innovative approach to

instruction, and share a common vision for our school are just a few of the many ways that my life is enriched as an administrator. Their dedication goes far beyond the length of a typical school day.

A real life scenario finds me walking across our school parking lot after an after-school meeting. It's not at all out of the ordinary for the time of day to be hovering around 4:45 pm or later. I will find anywhere from 8-10 cars belonging to faculty members still parked in the same space they parked ten hours earlier. No, they're not waiting for a tow-truck to repair their cars and no one has a flat tire. These teachers are still hard at it in their classrooms, or helping to coach one of the athletic teams, or meeting with one of the school clubs. Odyssey of the Mind wouldn't happen without the long hours spent after school, Math League wouldn't happen, Literacy Nights would not find a spot on the calendar, junior high dances would never become reality without the faculty who serve as chaperones and plan the event. After school tutoring sessions, drum-line and choir practice, and parent phone calls, emails and conferences and curriculum meetings are all commitments awaiting the teacher after the last bus has pulled out, the last child has been safely delivered to After-Care or the last child has gotten in the car with news of the school day that has ended for everyone but the teacher. I have often said that the busiest part of the school day is after the last bell has sounded. I think it worth mentioning that our teachers are not compensated for the extra time after school as our counterparts in the public sector. Once again, I can recall a Math League meet being held at one of the local public schools. One of the teachers was complaining that she had not yet received her stipend from the previous meet. I was flabbergasted! Honestly, I felt so naïve when I said to her... "You get paid for doing Math League?" I'd never heard of such a foolish thing.

Weekends and school holidays for us simply means a little extra time to get things done...grading papers, writing plans, updating bulletin boards. It's what we do as part of answering God's call...fulfilling the duties and responsibilities of our vocation. Catholic school teachers do not have an *occupation*, they are fulfilling a vocation. Therein lays a difference. Okay....one more true story....I once worked with a teacher who had retired from a first career at a relatively young age. This particular individual sought out a second degree in education because of the desire to work and have the summers off. It was quite the revelation when working nights and weekends became the norm. I found it very humorous when this teacher shared with me; (more than just a little frustrated)... "I'm working harder than I ever have in my life!"

Commitment:

36% of our faculty members have served HCS for over 15 years.
14% of our faculty members have served HCS for over 20 years.
75% of our faculty and staff members have enrolled their children, either past or present at HCS.
100% have answered a call.
100% of them are truly unsung heroes.

I am humbled to walk and work alongside of them, and I rejoice in the opportunity.

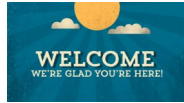

Cemetery News

People are always surprised to hear that we still have grave spaces available. The fact is that we are running out of full size in-ground graves – we project that this will occur in about 16 to 18 years. That plus the fact that there are no plans to develop a new cemetery will present a dilemma for future parishioners, but there are ways to help address the shortage. Options to be considered when acquiring interment space(s) include: (a) a double depth grave whereby one casket is interred above another casket, (b) a mausoleum crypt for one or two caskets, and (c) cremation with interment either in-ground or above-ground. Like many cemeteries, families purchased plots with several graves intended for family members in the future. In many cases and for many reasons, the graves were never used as intended. Families that still have graves that will never be used can transfer those graves back to Holy Cross. To discuss further, contact our Cemetery Administrator, Len Dornberger, at 674-5787 x135.
