

## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

#### **PASTOR'S COLUMN**

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday – the Sunday after Christmas – the Church celebrates the feast of the Holy Family. This is year marks the 125th anniversary of this feast honoring Jesus, Mary and Joseph; it was added to the Church calendar by Pope Leo XIII in 1893.

Family Matters. In our culture, when we speak about a family, in terms of composition, we usually speak of it being made up of father, mother and child. That order of reference (father, mother, child) is pretty common. Thus, for you Flintstones fan's we speak of Fred, Wilma and Pebbles; for you royal-watchers we speak of Prince William, Kate and George; and of course, there were Mike, Carol and the Brady kids. We sometime hear the order amended as woman, man, and child (for you I Love Lucy fans, Lucy, Ricky and Little Ricky). However, when we speak of the Holy Family, that entire order -of-reference is flipped on its head. We never speak of Joseph, Mary and Jesus; rather we speak of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. And the question to consider here is very much the same question I asked when the movie Jaws 4 came out in 1987: Why? Well, while laws 4 still remains a mystery, I have some thoughts on the unique manner in which we refer to the Holy Family.

**Son Shines.** The Holy Family as Jesus, Mary and Joseph demarcates three important distinctions for us. First, it reminds us that Holy Family, while an exemplar for all families, is unique as it marks that family which embraced the new creation, and bringing forth of God incarnate. Second, it reminds us that the Holy Family, as a faithful family, put the Lord God first in their lives. Third, in our Catholic faith we understand a child is a gift from God, and thus we place God's gift (Jesus – son of Mary, Son of God) front-and-center... focusing us on what God gave Mary (as mother) and Joseph (as foster father): Jesus.

All families who seek to be holy families place Jesus first in their faith, in their life and in their words and deeds. On this topic of the special role and place of the Holy Family in our Catholic faith, Pope Benedict XVI wrote what I commend to you as one of the most beautiful commentaries on the topic that I have ever read, and on this Holy Family Sunday, I'd like to share that reflection with you:

The Gospel according to Luke recounts that when the shepherds of Bethlehem had received the Angel's announcement of the Messiah's birth "they went with haste, and found Mary and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger" (2:16). The first eyewitnesses of Jesus' birth therefore beheld a family scene: a mother, a father and a newborn son. For this reason the Liturgy has us celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family on the First Sunday after Christmas. This year it occurred the very day after Christmas, and, taking precedence over the Feast of St Stephen, invites us to contemplate this "icon" in which the little Jesus appears at the center of his parents' affection and care.

In the poor grotto of Bethlehem — the Fathers of the Church wrote — shines a very bright light, a reflection of the profound mystery which envelopes that Child, which Mary and Joseph cherish in their

hearts and which can be seen in their expression, in their actions, and especially in their silence. Indeed, they preserve in their inmost depths the words of the Angel's Annunciation to Mary: "the Child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God" (Luke 1:35).

Yet every child's birth brings something of this mystery with it! Parents who receive a child as a gift know this well and often speak of it in this way. We have all heard people say to a father and a mother: "this child is a gift, a miracle!". Indeed, human beings do not experience procreation merely as a reproductive act but perceive its richness and intuit that every human creature who is born on earth is the "sign" par excellence of the Creator and Father who is in Heaven.

How important it is, therefore, that every child coming into the world be welcomed by the warmth of a family! External comforts do not matter: Jesus was born in a stable and had a manger as his first cradle, but the love of Mary and of Joseph made him feel the tenderness and beauty of being loved. Children need this: the love of their father and mother. It is this that gives them security and, as they grow, enables them to discover the meaning of life. The Holy Family of Nazareth went through many trials, such as the "massacre of the innocents" — as recounted in the Gospel according to Matthew — which obliged Joseph and Mary to flee to Egypt. Yet, trusting in divine Providence, they found their stability and guaranteed Jesus a serene childhood and a sound upbringing.

Dear friends, the Holy Family is of course unique and unrepeatable, but at the same time it is a "model of life" for every family because Jesus, true man, chose to be born into a human family and thereby blessed and consecrated it.

When March Comes in January. These words speak clearly about the significance of the Holy Family and the value of the family in our world. And so, for us in faith and in life, we are called to honor this Holy Family and we are called to protect the gift and the mystery embodied in the person of each child born into the families of our nation and world. One of the many ways that we can do this is to attend the annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. At that March, people of different faiths and denominations gather to support the basic idea that innocent human life should be protected from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death. This January, the March for Life will be held on Wednesday, January 18th, 2019. Folks from Holy Cross and Immaculate Conception, and from many parishes throughout our diocese are encouraged to attend and represent the values of our Catholic faith. Check the parish bulletin over the next few weeks for more information on this important event.

May you and your family continue to be blessed as we continue through this beautiful season of Christmas!

#### **Samaritan Tree**



#### Retrouvaille....a lifeline for Marriages


