

## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.





## NUESTRA FAMILIA

- El domingo 6 de diciembre celebraremos la Epifanía del Señor, conocido como día de Reyes, tendremos nuestra tradicional Rosca de Reyes. Los reyes llegaron para adorar al Niño y darle aguinaldo a nuestros niños. Si usted desea colaborar con una Rosca o con una olla de atole o champurrado hable con la Sra. Arline Dosman.
- La fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Candelaria tienen lugar generalmente el 2 de febrero, marcando la presentación oficial de Jesús en el Templo de Jerusalén, 40 días después de Navidad, cuando la Virgen María ha sido purificada, siguiendo la ley del Antiguo Testamento. En inglés se le conoce como Candlemas, porque en Europa existía la tradición de traer velas a la iglesia para ser bendecidas como parte de la celebración. Es habitual que haga una convivencia después de la misa y a las personas que les salió el Niño Jesús en la 'Rosca de Reyes', el 6 de enero, tengan que hacer tamales y atole, ambos platos a base de maíz. Esta tradición también tiene raíces prehispánicas, ya que muchos acostumbran llevar su maíz a la iglesia a fin de bendecir sus cosechas después de plantar sus semillas para el nuevo ciclo agrícola que está a punto de comenzar. Pueden traer viste a una imagen del Niño Jesús a la misa antes de colocarlo en un nicho donde permanecerá por el resto de ese año.
- Necesitamos: Lectores, Ministros Extraordinarios de la Comunión (necesitan ser aprobado por el párroco), Ujieres. Ministerio de la Música. Comparte con otros los talentos que el Señor les ha dado.
- Los Bautismos son los primeros domingos de cada mes, después de la Santa Misa en Español 2:30 pm. La clase pre-bautismales son los segundos domingos de cada mes. Los requisitos para ser padrinos tienen que ser Católicos practicante, y en comunión con la iglesia.
