

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

This week, during Catholic School's Week, I turn my column over to the principal of STMA, Ms. Casey.

Greetings Parishioners,

I feel blessed to have had the opportunity to start and conclude our celebration of National Catholic Schools Week by speaking to you at Masses last week, and now again by way of the Pastor's Column! It was incredibly heartwarming to hear from so many of you wishing to share your thanks and congratulations for STMA's achievements and for your pledges to keep me and our school in your prayers. It was wonderful to see and hear from so many former students and families as well. To know that you are out there in the "real world" studying and working hard to be the young men and women God intended is a wonderful reminder that God reaps what he sows in our Catholic schools. In fact, I'd like to share two stories of STMA graduates which I feel illustrate that point, and, more importantly, the mission of our school with you today.

The mother of one of our alumni reached out to me recently to share what she found to be a surprising and moving comment her son made during an occasion of public speaking about his time in high school. Speaking to a crowd of educators, this young man reflected that his favorite part about Saint Thomas More Academy was attending weekly Mass as a school. This was striking to her, and again for me when she relayed the story, primarily because this young man was Jewish, not Catholic. He explained that while our Masses did not represent his personal faith tradition, he appreciated the regular opportunity for quiet introspection and spiritual nourishment. I imagine it was a powerful experience for him, a student who had attended a public elementary school and who may have felt like an outsider at the outset of his Catholic high school experience, to have found acceptance and a place in the "family" during those Masses.

Another alumnus approached me after Mass last Sunday to tell me that he is happy and doing well in his studies at Delaware State University. I admit I was surprised to see him as I recalled he was not Catholic. It was great to see him and to catch up, but I couldn't square my memory with his presence at our Catholic church. It was then that he shared with me that he is currently enrolled in the RCIA program at Holy Cross. His words were, "the seeds Saint Thomas More planted have taken root!" I left that Mass feeling so proud of him and so eager to report this back to my faculty. Please pray for him as he begins this journey of faith!

"Prosper the work of our hands!" (Psalms 90:17). God truly works to use our Catholic schools as fertile ground for raising up young men and women to consider not just their studies, but their souls. Father Lentini shared a beautiful homily with the students of Holy Cross Elementary and Saint Thomas More Academy during Catholic Schools Week in which he reminded us that the great blessing of Catholic schooling is that it trains students not for a living, but for a life. Well said, Father!

Though faith will always serve as the reason for our being, another key element of our mission is to achieve high standards of academics. I'm proud to report that our standardized testing scores outpace our rival schools. The Class of 2018 had an average SAT score of 1167. Our average is 100 points higher than the national average, and 170 points higher than the state average. In a competitive college admissions field, our Ravens soar high! That same graduating class of 36 students was offered \$6 million in college scholarships, of which they were able to accept \$1.8 million. I feel confident in saying our pursuit of graduating well-rounded citizens ready to embrace their God-given gifts has been, and continues to be, successful. We provide this exceptional high school experience at the lowest tuition in the Diocese, indicative of our commitment to remain accessible to families seeking a quality Catholic education for their children.

Perhaps our biggest challenge is being known in our community, so I ask you to inquire about our school, encourage family, friends and neighbors to do the same, and to help me recognize the good work of our faculty, staff, and students. If you have never been to our campus, fellow parishioners, please visit us for a sports game, drama production, or fundraising event. Our basketball season continues into February, with schedules published on www.ravenssports.com. The Midnight Dreary Players will present *Little Shop of Horrors* March 29-31 at STMA. And our next big fundraiser is our annual ForeverMORE Silent Auction on Saturday, February 23. Tickets are on sale now! Please follow us on Facebook, or tour our campus on our website.

As a final note, I'll remind you that now is the time to apply for the 2019-20 school year. We welcome new applicants. Thank you again for this opportunity to share with you, and may God continue to bless this parish and both of its schools.

Fertilization - At the start of this week, you ovulate. SCHOOL INFORMATION

One of the things I love most about Holy Cross School is the dynamic, the culture, the “heart” of our student community. Our students are kind to each other, they welcome visitors, they love when we host a shadow student for the day, they enjoy helping one another, they launch gigantic, enormous community service projects of their own volition. Enzo’s pajama drive to benefit unfortunate children, Reagan and Payton’s Buckets of Love for children who are hospitalized or home bound due to illness, Hunter and Savannah’s art sale to benefit the homeless are just a few of the venture initiated by Holy Cross students. It is important that you realize that these projects are far reaching across the state, [or beyond] and that these children are self-starters. Yes, I’d like to think that they acquired their sense of providing for others as part of their Catholic school education, but, the truth of the matter is that HCS has no part in these grassroots efforts. We have supported their efforts, but these children have launched these efforts on their own, out of the pure goodness of their hearts. These efforts are by no means to be characterized as random acts of kindness.

However, there is such a thing and Google tells me that practicing Random Acts of Kindness started as far back as 1982 when a restaurant patron wrote the following message on her placemat.

"practice random acts of kindness and senseless acts of beauty"

Such a simple few words sparked a nationwide movement to treat one another with compassion, thoughtfulness and charity of heart. It’s a shame that it necessitated a nationwide movement to help us understand that we should see the face of Jesus in others, but apparently it did, and now there’s a special day in February set aside for everyone to focus on random acts of kindness. I guess when that day is over with we don’t have to do it anymore, until next February??

Last week we were honored to have with us a lady who is no stranger to kindness in its most chaste sense, compassion, and pure selflessness. Ms. Veronica Daniels became known to us through the intercession of Mrs. Wegemer. Mrs. Wegemer has a student in her class who has a bonafied link to Ms. Daniels. His name is Ryan and he affectionately refers to Ms. Daniels as Aunt Roni. Ms. Daniels, a career nurse was called upon by the Sisters of Charity in India to serve in the capacity of caregiver to Mother Teresa of Calcutta in the last days of her life. In her goodness she was agreeable to three age-appropriate presentations. In sharing some of her artifacts, pictures of she and Mother Teresa, and the history of her work with the “poorest of the poor” our students listened to Ms. Daniels retell of her experience with the woman who would elevated to sainthood in her own lifetime.

We were truly blessed to meet and have the opportunity to ask questions of Ms. Daniels. In her humble manner, she shared with us firsthand information about a woman who we now know as St. Teresa of Calcutta. As for me, to have shaken the hand that touched the hands of a modern-day saint was an experience that I will never forget.

The message that Ms. Daniels left us with is certainly one that we can easily identify with. She told us that St. Teresa, during her life inspired countless numbers with her motto, “Not all of us can do great things, but we can all do small things with great love.” The small things that she did and the tiny woman that she was captivated the entire world. We were blessed to have had a first-hand recounting of the story right here at Holy Cross School.
