

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

A well-off young man is opening his BMW's car door, when a speeding car comes along and hits the door, ripping it off and knocking the man to the ground. A Police Officer nearby runs over to offer assistance to the man, who is lying on the ground bruised and bleeding. He looks up at the officer and says, "Look at what they did to my BMW. That's a \$60,000 car and its ruined. And, look, my \$500 pair of pants ripped when I hit the ground. And my \$600 pair of shoes are scuffed up." The officer says, "It's worse than that sir, maybe you're in shock and didn't notice -- but your left arm was ripped off in the accident." The man looks down to where his arm used to be, and he screams, and screams! He looks up at the officer still screaming and says, "This is terrible, now my Rolex is gone, too!"

Of Money, Evil and Pessimists. Some folks, like the man in the joke above, make themselves the sum of their possessions, and their wealth (or lack of it) defines them. In our faith, it is not what is in our wallet that defines us, but what is in our heart, and how we live our life. As a matter of fact, on the topic of money, scripture tells that "Love of money is the root of all evil." (1 Timothy 6:10). Good advice! (My advice on money is less idealistic, I commend people to always borrow from a pessimist, because he won't expect to have it paid back!)

Avoid Possession Obsession. For all of that, money is, nevertheless, a part of our everyday life: we earn it, we spend it, we invest it, we carry it in our wallets and purses, we deposit it, we withdraw it, etc. But scripture gives us an out: so long as we don't develop a "love of money" we should be okay. So, long as we don't become the sum of our possessions, we should be okay.

Those of you who are familiar with me will know that the one thing that I detest doing as a Priest is asking for money. I fancy the Church as a spiritual home not a financial one. But then I realize that in order to function, in order to continue to do Christ's good work, in order to keep our Church and parish maintained, money is needed. And as Pastor, that is part of the ministerial role which lands on my plate, and thus from time to time, I have to engage in discussing money. Well, today, is one of those times where I have to step up and make an appeal about, well, an Appeal.

An Appeal. The 2019 Annual Catholic Appeal, themed as "*As I have done for you, you should also do,*" will be conducted in parishes throughout the diocese next weekend. Funds generated by the Appeal provide pastoral, charitable, and educational ministries to tens of thousands of people in our 12-County diocese.



A Body of Work. As Catholics and as members of a Parish of the Diocese of Wilmington, it is important that we reach out in service to others by sharing our resources. Just as we are one in the Body of Christ, we must remember that we are one with

brothers and sisters in Christ in our other parishes in the Diocese. The Annual Catholic Appeal offers us a chance to work in collaboration to aid our Diocese in doing its good work by sharing the gifts God has granted us.

Goal Tending. For this coming year, our Parish target for the annual appeal is \$215,000 (which in my mind is understood as the equivalent of 53,750 Big Macs). This goal amount is comparable to last year's goal which we exceeded. Your financial support also provides funding for your parish since 100% of monies collected above our target will be returned for our own ministerial needs.

So, I ask you to please give prayerful consideration to helping the Diocese in assisting the thousands of individuals and families who receive needed aid by way of the 37 ministries supported by the Annual Catholic Appeal. If you can, please decide ahead of time the contribution you wish to make this year and come to Church next weekend prepared to offer your support.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

Educators are by their very nature an inquisitive lot. We are not only encouraged to be lifelong learners, but we have a certain penchant for it. I know I've already been approached by several teachers who are eager to seek out and enroll in professional development sessions for the summer. We spend hours and hours researching anything new or the tried and true methods, the best practices; all for the benefit of our students. And we come back to school filled with excitement to put into practice what we learned. To try out the new something that might make a difference for Johnny or Susie.

I am no different, I have always been a poser of questions, of delving into the why, or the when, or the how of a topic of interest. Perhaps that's why I have always enjoyed Math so much---there is always a definitive answer, and in most cases one that can be proven! Over the past few weeks I've found myself asking a few questions about the current liturgical season. I believe I have answers for a few of my questions---but what about you? So I conducted a little research and I stumbled upon a little quiz testing my knowledge of the season. The "wherefores," the "whens", the "hows" and the "whats." It was fun, although my score was not a perfect one.

[1. Ash Wednesday is a Holy Day of Obligation.](#)

Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation as many mistakenly believe. It is certainly a good idea to start out the season of Lent with this important Mass, which reminds us of the penitence we are to be practicing during the season.

[2. Why do we receive ashes on Ash Wednesday?](#)

We receive ashes as a reminder of our repentance, sorrow, and humility, as ashes symbolize in the Bible. They also remind us that "thou art dust, and to dust thou shall return."

[3. Why do Catholics set aside Fridays as particularly sacrificial days?](#)

Fridays are always considered sacrificial days, both during Lent and during the rest of the year, because Christ died for us on the cross on a Friday. Thus, we abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent, when we are particularly meditating upon Christ's sacrifice for us. This penance is most often not eating meat, but some prefer to substitute with another kind of food..

[4. A day of fast means eating only one full meal during the day.](#)

True: Fasting is required of those Catholics ages 18-59, whose health permits, and allows only one full meal to be each day of fasting. Two small meals are permitted, if necessary, and together should not equal one full meal. Eating between meals is to be avoided, as well.

[5. What is the alternate name for Holy Thursday?](#)

Holy Thursday is also known as Maundy Thursday. The name Maundy comes from the Latin antiphon Mandatum Novum, "a new mandate". This is in reference to John 13:34, in which Jesus gives us a new commandment – "Love one another as I have loved you," said after he washed the disciples' feet, a tradition often repeated at the Mass on Holy Thursday.

[5. Traditionally, what time do many churches begin their Good Friday services?](#)

Christ was on the cross between the hours of noon and 3pm, at which time He died. These three hours, the most solemn and sacred hours of the Church year, are often kept as hours of silence, with many Catholics refraining from music, television, computer, or any other similar amusements or distractions. Many churches then begin their Good Friday services at 3pm, the hour in which Christ died for us. Just as is the case with Ash Wednesday, Good Friday is not a holy day of obligation in the Church. Again, however, it is an important day in the Church and it is highly encouraged that people attend the Good Friday service.
