

## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

Over the history of TV and movies, there have been many characters that have imparted wisdom to the other characters in the story being told. *Star Wars* saw Yoda as the font of wisdom, guiding young Luke Skywalker to a sense of understanding that would help him to become a Jedi. But before there was a Yoda or anything like that, there was an even more off-beat, quirky-as-anything wanna-be philosopher on TV. Who was this Socrates of the 60s of whom I speak? Well, I would posit that the most philosophical of all TV characters was probably Dobie Gillis from the 1959-1963 TV series, "The Many Loves of Dobie Gillis." On a weekly basis, the show would begin with Dobie Gillis, a high school teenager, posing in front of a statue of Rodin's "The Thinker." Breaking the fourth wall, young Dobie Gillis would look at the audience and ponder and philosophize over a specific situation that he was facing in life. It was often introspective, sometime quirky, but always funny.

On the topic of imparting wisdom, many of our Saint perform the role of both Yoda and Dobie Gillis for us, though, they do it within the context of faith, rather than that of comedy or entertainment. I want to spend this column identifying some beautiful reflections written by some of the saints whose feast day fall during the Season of Lent. There wisdom is always welcome, quite timeless and very spiritually nourishing. And so, though not posing in front of a statue of "The Thinker," I give you the wisdom of the saints:

**St. Francis of Paolo, Hermit (April 2)** – on forgiving fully: "Pardon one another so that later on you will not remember the injury. The recollection of an injury is itself wrong. It adds to our anger, nurtures our sin and hates what is good. It is a rusty arrow and poison for the soul. It puts all virtue to flight. It is like a worm in the mind: it confuses our speech and tears to shreds our petitions to God. It is foreign to charity: it remains planted in the soul like a nail. It is wickedness that never sleeps, sin that never fails. It is indeed a daily death."

**St. Isidore, Bishop of Doctor of the Church (April 4)** – on God's Grace and human intellect: "The man who is slow to grasp things but who really tries hard is rewarded; equally he who does not cultivate his God-given intellectual ability is condemned for despising his gifts and sinning by sloth. Learning unsupported by grace may get into our ears; it never reaches the heart. It makes a great noise outside but serves no inner purpose. But when God's grace touches our innermost minds to bring understanding, his word, which has been received by the ear, sinks deep into the heart."

**St. Vincent Ferrer, Priest (April 5)** – on charity: "Finally, if you truly want to help the soul of your neighbor, you should approach God first with all your heart. Ask him simply to fill you with charity, the greatest of all virtues; with it you can accomplish what you desire."

**St. John Baptiste de la Salle (April 7)** – to Catholic educators: "Be driven by the love of God then, because Jesus Christ died for all, that those who live may not live for themselves but for him who died and rose for them. Let your students be moved by your untiring care for them and feel as though God were encouraging them through you, because you perform your duties as ambassadors of Christ. Above all, let your charity and zeal show how you love the Church. Your work is for the Church, which is the body of Christ. By your diligence show your love for those whom God has given you, just as Christ loved the Church."

**St. Martin I, Pope (April 13)** – On Living Faithful as Christians: "Christians who are known to live in the area have taken on pagan ways, showing none of that charity which human beings, even barbarians, regularly display in numerous compassionate deeds... [G]od wishes all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth through the prayers of Peter. Hence, I pray that God will strengthen their hearts in the orthodox faith, help them to stand firm against every heretic and enemy of the church, and guard them unshaken... that none may fall or go astray or renounce anything, however trifling, which they professed in writing in the sight of the Lord and his holy angels. In this way, together with me in my humiliation, they will receive the crown of justice in the true faith from the hand of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

**St. Anselm, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (April 21)** – A prayer for awareness of God: "O supreme and inaccessible light, O complete and blessed truth, how far you are from me, even though I am so near to you! How remote you are from my sight, even though I am present to yours! You are everywhere in your entirety, and yet I do not see you; in you I move and have my being, and yet I cannot approach you; you are within me and around me, and yet I do not perceive you. O God, let me know you and love you so that I may find my joy in you; and if I cannot do so fully in this life, let me at least make some progress every day, until at last that knowledge, love and joy come to me in all their plenitude. While I am here on earth let me learn to know you better, so that in heaven I may know you fully; let my love for you grow deeper here, so that there I may love you fully. On earth then I shall have great joy in hope, and in heaven complete joy in the fulfilment of my hope."

These pearls of Wisdom are taken from the writings of the saints; saints who called us to serve God with fervor, with truth and with fidelity. As we draw close to the Lord during this season of Lent, let these admonitions remind of the ways and manners in which are blessed to be able to draw near. I wish you continued spiritual growth during this season of Lent.

## SCHOOL INFORMATION

“Holy Cross School is an *academically rich*, faith-filled learning environment...” These words are taken directly from our school mission statement. The mission statement for our school is recited daily as a part of our daily morning-prayer custom. It is often true that when a practice is repeated habitually the overall intended meaning and significance become lost. I admit to having that concern, however, I can assure you that our faculty has not lost sight of the significance of those few words of our mission statement. As a result of the serious approach taken to providing an academic richness in our curriculum we find ourselves in frequent discussion as to ways to enhance the learning experience at Holy Cross.

Over the past few years we have added classes to the list of those offered as enrichment for our junior high students. I remember it was quite the hub-bub when we first added the Robotics class to the list of offerings along with classes offered in Music and Art. Mrs. Benini designed a curriculum for Visual Journaling for the more serious and talented artist and then Mrs. Williams added Engineering for the sixth graders who would later demonstrate an interest in Robotics. As of last year we added Spanish back in the enrichment line-up as a mandated class for all seventh and eighth grade students. We will always be grateful to Mrs. Evelyn Jocson for her willingness to step up to the task of teaching in her retirement. Her infectious spirit and love for the language is inspirational.

And so it was during an afternoon conversation with Mrs. Zink last year that she mentioned her love for teaching Journalism and how she would like to teach a class in the junior high. One thing led to another and before we both knew it she had consented to take on the task of our school yearbook. She did so with great enthusiasm and found herself putting a course outline together almost immediately. In a hurry as I entered the ELC entrance one day, she enthusiastically yelled “I’m going to call the class Publication Design!” “I love that!” I yelled back.

The class began this past fall with a roster of eleven students. Mrs. Zink’s students were able to learn techniques that incorporated photography, layout and design, along with her much loved journalism. “The yearbook is an undertaking,” and is much better suited as an organized class as opposed to an after school club.

The students were given journalistic roles like copy editor, section editor and story writer. It has also served as a valuable lesson for her students in meeting critical deadlines, lessons in team work, and editing. Besides creating the yearbook, students learned marketing techniques using an on-line publication software which allowed them to make flyers for school events.

I have had the pleasure of being interviewed by two of her students for two separate feature articles. I can attest to the high level of preparedness of both Freddy and Madison. I was most impressed by their questions, the time and thought evidenced in formulating their questions and their professional approach to the interview. I have also been impressed by the offering of their free time. As an example, Nadine was the standout volunteer for photographing events on Vocations Awareness Day. Nadine is a seventh grade student and could very easily have taken her day off along with her peers. But she came to and looked much the roving reporter with fancy camera in hand throughout the day. These roving reporter types could also have been found taking photos of the Fall Festival, after school clubs, athletic events, and the Mother Son Dance, all during their “off from school time!”

“Being the first year, it was a learning curve for all of us which will make the class even better in 2019-2020 SY” Mrs. Zink admits that she will miss her eighth graders, Anthony, Elizabeth, Kimberly, Mia, Jada, Jaylynn, and Meghan.
