

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

I, like most priests, receive a monthly newsletter from the Catholic League for Civil and Religious Rights. I also (evidently) have been signed up to get online news updates from them. And I get a bunch of them. Sometimes I find some Catholic League's stuff to be hyperbolic, or polemical (though none the less, always interesting). So, I read it with a critical eye, and then check out on my own, the details of what they report.

Bully for You! Recently, I received one of those email updates from the Catholic League, and the headline was "PA Lawmaker Bullies Elderly Woman." Now, I could not imagine what that article was about; I mean, the idea that a lawmaker would "bully" some old lady seemed coo-coo for Cocoa Puffs crazy. The email stated: "She [the old lady] was praying, with a rosary in hand, in front of a Planned Parenthood clinic. For eight uninterrupted minutes, [Rep. Brian] Sims badgered her, telling her to go pray at home. When she asked him to stop, he followed her around and threatened to make her home address public so that others could harass her."

Let's go to the Videotape. I thought for sure: This is just some hyperbolic and exaggerated moment of conflict between a lawmaker and a constituent. But I was wrong. After looking into the matter from other sources, I believe that the article headline was too reserved; perhaps "intensely haranguing" or "browbeating" would have been more accurate than "bullying." State Rep. Brian Sims of Pennsylvania, not only harassed, harangued and browbeat this old lady for praying in front of a Planned Parenthood Clinic, he actually brazenly took a video of the encounter and proudly posted it. I watched the video -- and let me say, it was painful to watch. He followed this lady as she walked and prayed her rosary. He berated her. He mocked her. He said things like:

- "Have you fed any children today or have you just stood out in front of a Planned Parenthood shaming people for something they have a Constitutional right to do?"
- "Actually, let's keep walking down the block. We can talk about this. We can talk about your Christian faith, about how your Christian faith believes in shaming people."
- "Today's protester, now she is an old white lady who is going to try to avoid showing you her face," adding that pro-life protestors, "They're racist, classist, bigots[.]"
- "There's no faith that tells you-you are right and everybody else is wrong. Don't convince yourself that what you are doing isn't extremely racist."

A Loon Again, Naturally. Later he tried a similar tactic on some teenage girls and their mom. Representative Sims played the scare card, the race card, the faith card, the class card, the shame card, and many other cards from the deck of loony far-left fringe, where hate seems to be a sacrament and faux outrage seems to be a strategy. Now, there are always folks like this in the world, but the problem is that this particular anti-Christian, pro-abortion man holds state office, and holds political power. Big problem!

Tough Talk. This has been a really troubling time in terms of political leaders and their treatment of the abortion issue. A few months ago, Virginia Governor Ralph Northam stirred a maelstrom of controversy when, while defending a proposed law that would allow third-trimester abortion, he commented on what would happen if a child survived an attempted abortion, just before birth. His response: "[I]f a mother is in labor, I can tell you exactly what would happen, the infant would be delivered. The infant would be kept comfortable. The infant would be resuscitated if that's what the mother and the family desired, and then a discussion would ensue between the physicians and the mother." So, in other words, a child effectively brought to term would be put aside, kept comfortable, and allowed to die unless the mother and the doctor agreed otherwise. Holy Hannah! Effectively killing a child who has been born -- what the heck is going on here?

More Tough Talk. And then there was Rep. Allen Rogers of Alabama, who in the course of a debating a bill that would give further protection to the unborn, said this: "I'm not about to be a male telling a woman what to do with her body... Some kids are unwanted, so you kill them now or you kill them later. You bring them into the world unwanted, unloved, you send them to the electric chair. So, you kill them now or kill them later." Short form: Because a kid may be born in less than an ideal circumstance, you kill that child because he might become a criminal later. I repeat my previous exclamation: What the heck is going on here?

Good News. So, over the past few weeks I received a few emails advising me that I shouldn't support Catholic Relief Services (CRS) (which, for example, is supported by the annual Rice Bowl campaign) because they support abortion and contraceptive services. I found the assertion patently beyond the pale, as these are areas from which CRS, like any Catholic or Catholic group, steer clear and oppose. But, as I am not oblivious to the ravages of secular humanism, the culture of death and the societal permissiveness on the world in which the Church functions, I decided to check the matter out myself.

I found that most of the allegations are from 2011-2013; they were raised by the *Lepanto Institute for the Restoration of All Things in Christ and the Population Research Institute*. CRS, in a statement, responded saying it is fully aware of the allegations, and that those allegations are false. The statement goes on to makes it clear that CRS does not partake in abortion, contraceptive services, or practices contrary to the Faith. This statement was detailed and specific, and, at least in my book, it lays the matter to rest. So, I implore you all to pray for an end to abortion, and for the conversion of heart of leaders who have bought the big lie, that they might come to embrace God's truth: He, not we, is the Lord and giver of life.
