

Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

Sacrament of Baptism. Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession). Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

Sacrament of Confirmation. Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

Sacrament of Marriage. Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

Sacrament of Holy Orders. If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick. For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

"I'm so glad we had this time together / just to have a laugh or sing a song / seems we just get started and before we know it / comes the time we have to say, 'So long.'" And thus, ended every episode of the Carol Burnett Show – perhaps the most famous variety show in TV history – from 1967 to 1978. When you heard these words, you knew the end of the show was near, and it was time for goodbye.

There are many signs of things coming to an end, for instance, a guy telling his girlfriend "we have to talk," or a girl telling her boyfriend "we have to talk," or your parole officer calling you and saying, "we have to talk, now!" And now my dear parishioners, "we have to talk."

June is often a time for goodbyes: for goodbyes to parish priests who move on to new assignments and for goodbyes to our elementary and high school students at our parish schools. This year, we check both boxes: We will be saying goodbye to one of our Parish priests and to a bunch of our students!

Goodbye Fr. Brady. Fr. Timothy Brady joined our Holy Cross and Immaculate Conception priestly family last May. I would say that it was certainly my impression and Fr. Brady's too, that this would have been at least a two-year assignment. But it turns out he will be leaving us after one year, and we will no longer be part of Brady's bunch (ouch).

What happened? It seems Fr. Olsen (a Holy Cross Priestly Alumnus) who was assigned to St. Michael the Archangel Church in Georgetown, has decided to leave the Diocese in order to enter into religious life as a priest with the Neo-Catechumenate Movement. This created a vacancy in Georgetown. To fill that unanticipated vacancy, the Diocese looked to Holy Cross/Immaculate Conception, as we had more priests than any other parish... and they chose to re-assign Fr. Brady to fill the vacancy, effective June 26. This was unexpected on all of our parts but that is part of the life of a Diocesan Priest as they do God's work in the vineyard of the world.

It has been a joy to have Fr. Brady with us. We have enjoyed countless lunches and dinners together around a jovial table, and he had a great sense of priestly fraternity with all of his brother priests. He will be greatly missed. As he moves 46 miles due south to Sussex County, we wish him well and hope that he visits us often. Like it used to say in the commercials for "Motel 6" -- we'll leave a light on for him!

Graduation Tears. "Graduation Tears" was a little-known song – a single released in 1965 – by Bobby Vinton. For those saying, "who's Bobby Vinton?" well, he was a popular singer in early 60s who racked up four #1 hits, and a top 40 recording of "Beer Barrel Polka." In any event, the words of that song, "Graduation Tears" not "Beer Barrel Polka," probably express well the feelings of our 8th graders and 12th graders as they approach that big day of Graduation: *"As I look all around my class, I see / that they all feel just the same as me. / We all have our hopes and fears / we're crying graduation tears... and even though we have*

to part / they'll always be close to my heart."



SCHOOL INFORMATION

There are certain people out there that just about everyone likes. Just that kind of guy that nobody can say anything bad about. Always friendly, always willing to go out of his way to help, the perennial volunteer; kids love him; just an all-around great guy. I know someone like that and I bet you do, too. The all-around great guy I know was the one who came to my aid and defense two summers ago when I was getting down to the proverbial wire in my search for an able bodied supervisor for our Before-Care program. Everybody knows him as Mr. Allen. I recall having come to know him when his son was in second grade and he volunteered for recess duty every single day. He was disappointed when the weather prevented us from going outdoors.

It's a great source of comfort for me when I pull in every morning and I see his navy blue pick-up truck parked outside of the cafeteria. Like most early-care programs I suppose, we begin at 6:30 every morning. On an average we welcome about 10-12 children to school at a time long before that first bell of the day rings. Mr. Allen is on hand with a friendly smile to greet mom or dad who also has an early start to the day. They know that Mr. Allen is there to make sure all is well with the world until school starts for the day. It's a great feeling knowing that your child is in the best of hands during your absence. Mr. Allen is on hand to assist with breakfast if needed---does Hannah need help stirring her yogurt? Is Nicholas doing okay with his French toast sticks? Are Jayce, Abigail and Michael playing nicely? Soon, Miss Belt will be in and helping where she can...perhaps with a restroom run, or just making casual conversation with the kids. At 7:40 the first bell of the day sounds. Who's the line leader today?? Miss Belt walks the littles over to the ELC and another day is underway.

What do bookends, oreo cookies, peanut butter and jelly spread between two gooey slices of white bread, and a day in the life of Holy Cross School---- all have in common? A top and bottom, a beginning and an end filled with goodness in the middle! Now, how is that an apt description of a day in the life of HCS? It's simple! The day starts with Mr. Allen. The school day experience is the goodness in the middle. The After-Care program is at the end! I was visiting in After-Care last week. Once again, when mom and dad's schedule dictates they are elsewhere at dismissal, they know that the children are in the very best of hands. Miss Carole, Mrs. Donohew, Miss Eleanore, Mr. Henry, Miss Rachel, Mrs. Sterner, and Mrs. Teeney run a tight ship with the gentlest of hands and the gentlest of voices. I watched as seven or eight boys relaxed and spread out on the floor of the Lego corner, Nicholas came over and showed me a necklace of red beads he had just made (the glue was still wet) for his sister's birthday present, there was a game of Statues being played with Miss Rachel and Miss Eleanore overseeing the fun, while Paul intently built Cootie models with Mrs. Teeney so he could show his mom when she arrived. A couple of girls played CandyLand and naturally, Mr. Henry is running a game of Go Fish with a group of young card players, while a few big kids are chatting among themselves. Mrs. Donohew is at the table to greet parents and sign out the children. For some, it's been a long day. But, for all it's been a good day. I remember clearly a day last winter when germs, disease, and infection had run amuck through our After-Care staff. Mrs. Donohew was recuperating from surgery and Miss Eleanore needed help fast! So, who are you going to call? That all-around nice guy who never says no.

I picked up the phone...."Mr. Allen, we could use a little help in the after-care." His response? "Yeah, I can do that!"




