## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

Dear Parishioners,

People often ask: Why are there holy days for Jesus and the Holy Spirit but not for God the Father. Well, on this Trinity Sunday we honor God the Father, in the context of the Holy Trinity. However, be aware that every Mass, every day is directed to God the Father and in praise of Him. In that sense, every day is Father's Day. (Shameful segue) ...And speaking of Father's Day: To all of you fathers out there, a very Happy Father's Day! Fathers, in equal share with mothers, form that fundamental building block of our society: the family! Dads: We honor you today!

**Three's Company.** This Sunday, we celebrate the Most Blessed Trinity – God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit: three Divine persons in one Divine Being. That is to say, there are three persons in one God; thus, God is both a unity and a trinity. This is one of the greatest mysteries of our faith.

**Mystery Date!** Do you love a mystery? I must confess, I do. One of my favorite mysteries came in the form of a trinity. For this trinity, let's put on our mood rings and puka beads, step into the wayback machine, and set the dial for the groovy year, 1970. In that year, NBC launched "The Sunday Mystery Movie," a TV program that began with a mysterious opening theme written by the late Henry Mancini. Interestingly, this TV series was actually three series which rotated in a three-week cycle: "Columbo" (my favorite; the LAPD's Lt. Columbo solves mysteries, in some cases, with a mere thread or a lock of hair), "McMillan and Wife" (a big city police commissioner and his nosy wife solved crimes) and "McCloud" (a western cowboy-type solved crimes for the New York City Police Department). For all intents and purposes, these three "Mystery Movies" were each independent TV series – but together, and individually, they were "The NBC Sunday Mystery Movie." There is an analogy to be made of this to the Most Blessed Trinity —but like all analogies it falls short but gives insight.

**Meanwhile in TVLand.** The analogy I could put forth, in light of what I wrote above, would be, that just as "Columbo," "McMillan" and "McCloud" are each distinct (one series is not the other), and all of them in whole or part are "The NBC Sunday Mystery Movie," so too, is God, the Trinity. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are distinct in persons, but each of them and all of them are God. This analogy falls short, of course, because the three TV series are artificially connected, and there's no relationship between them. Additionally, there is no love and no free will in their connection. So, this nice, TVLand-based analogy falls short; the mystery of the Trinity abides.

**Unsolved Mysteries?** Speaking of mystery, on TV detective shows like I mentioned above, a "mystery" is something that we are called to solve. Hence, Columbo gets on the trail of a killer and works to solve that murder. But, imagine sitting in front of your television and at the end of a "Columbo" episode Lt. Columbus doesn't solve the crime, rather he shrugs, and says, "Well, I guess it's just a mystery I'll never be able to solve it." Well, drop the cheese doodles and spill my Coke! It can't end

like that! After all, mysteries are supposed to be solved, right?

**Meanwhile in Theology Land.** Now, let's step out of TVLand for a moment, and step into theology land. Unlike in TVLand, in theology land, mysteries are not things to be solved; they are things to be pondered, to be reflected upon, to be prayed upon, and to be considered. These sacred mysteries we encounter in the Church, the Trinity being the chief one, are matters which can often only be grasped by use of analogy or be understood in small parts and bits. These are mysteries we will never fully comprehend (kind of like, how did Mr. Belvedere run for five seasons).

**Essentials.** The Church teaches that the Trinity is "the most fundamental and essential teaching in the hierarchy of the truths of the faith... [because it is] the source of all the other mysteries of faith, [and] the light that enlightens them." Thus, while God is a Trinity, which lies in mystery, He is also the means by which we are able grasp some understanding – however incomplete – of that Trinity.

**What Can I Say?** So, if the Trinity is a mystery, and analogies to explain it (like St. Patrick's use of a shamrock, or my use of the "Mystery Movie") ultimately fall short, is there anything we can actually say about the Most Holy Trinity? Yes, there are, ironically, three things that Catechism identifies as Dogma related to the Trinity:

1. *The Trinity is One.* So, we are not professing that there are three Gods, but one God in three persons. Thus, we baptize in the name (not the names) of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. There is only one God!
2. *The Divine Persons are really distinct from one another.* The Catechism says that "God is one, but not solitary." This is to say that the terms "Father," "Son" and "Holy Spirit" are not just human monikers put upon different actions or modes of God. No! Those names reflect distinct persons: The Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Father, the Holy Spirit is not the Father or the Son, etc. Yet each and all are the supreme divinity: God.
3. *The Divine persons are relative to one another.* The relationship of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is the only marked distinction; so, it is only in relatedness that the Trinity shows distinction – in all other ways the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are one.

So, this Sunday, as you come into or leave church, bless yourself with the holy water from our blessing font. Let it remind you of that day of your Baptism; the day when you were baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity is the most important truth of faith but known to us only by the gift of faith. A gift for which we should fall to our knees and give thanks and praise, this day and every day.


## NUESTRA FAMILIA


