## Information About Reception of the Sacraments

The seven Sacraments of the Church were instituted by Christ to confer grace.

**Sacrament of Baptism.** Call the parish office to register for the parents' pre-Baptismal instruction. For adults seeking to enter the Church and be Baptized, contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Penance (Confession).** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for Confession at age seven, as part of First Communion preparation.

**Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.** Children in our religious education program and school are prepared for First Communion at age seven. Adults seeking First Communion should contact our Religious Ed. Office

**Sacrament of Confirmation.** Young people in our parish are prepared for reception of Confirmation in the ninth grade (age 14). For adults seeking Confirmation contact our Religious Ed. Office.

**Sacrament of Marriage.** Couples planning for Marriage are to contact a parish priest or deacon one year in advance to set the wedding date and plan for pre-Cana instruction.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders.** If you believe you have, or someone you know has, a vocation to the Priesthood or Diaconate, please contact one of our parish priests.

**Anointing of the Sick.** For the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (sometimes called "Last Rites") administered by a Priest, a person or immediate family member must make the request. Late night requests may not be able to be answered until the next day. For a visitation to the sick, or Holy Communion to the sick, contact our parish office.

“To everything (turn, turn, turn), there is a season (turn, turn, turn), and a time to every purpose, under heaven.” Thus, sang the Byrds — the band, not a misspelled version of the flying creatures that decorate my truck — back in 1965. “It’s the time of the season...” Thus, sang the Zombies — the band not the living dead — back in 1968. And as summer winds down, let’s recall that, “We had joys, we had fun, we had seasons in the sun, but the wine and the songs, like the season, have all gone.” In 1974, singer Terry Jack crooned those lyrics in the uber-depressing “Seasons in the Sun.”

**Joanie, Chachi, and White Puka-Beads.** And indeed, the season has all but gone, and it is the time of this season to turn, turn, turn to what lies ahead! And the non-scientific demarcation of the end of summer, and a turn toward the fall, is upon us: Labor Day. With the arrival of Labor Day things change. The beach traffics begins to abate, free standing ice cream stands begin to prepare for their fall closing, schools everywhere are opened, and the new TV season kicks off. More traditionally, Labor Day marks another change: it is indeed the time of the season when those white shoes, white wallets, white handbags, white pants, white moo-moos, white puka-beads and those white hats get tossed onto the “Joannie Loves Chachi DVD,” “Dot Matrix Printer,” “Commodore 64,” “Cabbage-Patch Kids,” and “Ginsu Knives” pile of forgotten items. Yes, the period of propitiously wearing white, which began, theoretically, on Memorial Day, ends, theoretically, with Labor Day.

**Going Through Customs.** So, maybe, in this time of the season, as we remind ourselves of the custom and tradition of “wearing white from Memorial Day to Labor Day,” it would likewise be a good time to remind ourselves of some of our Church’s customs, disciplines and practices. And so, as I do annually, here is a refresher on some aspects of our faith and related customs:

- **Easter Duty:** Every Catholic has the duty to receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season; likewise, each of the faithful have the duty to make Confession at least once a year if conscious of mortal sin. For the purposes of defining “Easter season” the Church stretches the season out to encompass all of Lent and Eastertime, all the way through Trinity Sunday. You might say, in its generosity, the Church adds some extra seasoning!
- **Genuflecting:** All persons who are physically able, when entering a Church with a visible tabernacle in the sanctuary of the Church, are called upon to genuflect prior to taking a seat. Genuflection is accomplished by kneeling down on the right knee (kind of like one would expect a suitor to do when proposing marriage to the woman he loves). This is a sign of reverence and respect to Christ our King, and is a reflection of the way, traditionally, a subject greets a King. This is a practice we all (k)need to remember.
- **Sacred Silence:** A Church is a sacred space reserved for silence and prayer. Before Mass many people come to Church to pray; today we oft find people who come to talk. An old priest once said, “Two people talking prevent forty people from praying.” We all have an obligation to keep the inside of the body of the Church prayerful. One should use

the area outside of a Church be it the narthex (gathering space), the parish hall, or other common space for talking to one another, and the body of the Church for talking to God.

- **Blessing.** The Holy Water font is meant to be used for people to “bless themselves” and remind themselves of the waters of Baptism. It is custom for a person to bless himself by dipping his right hand in the font and then make the sign of the cross.
- **Fasting Before Holy Communion.** Bruce Springsteen sang that “Everybody’s got a hungry heart.” That may be true, but sometimes hunger (and thirst) needs to be put in check. Thus, the Church prescribes abstaining from food and drink for one hour before receiving Holy Communion. Canon #919 states: “*One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion.*” This means no doughnuts, no candy, no Big Macs, no Pop-Tarts and no Coca-Cola (and other items in the Fr. Lentini diet plan) before Mass. The requirement does not include the taking of medicine or needed-consumption. In the 1973, Pope Paul VI exempted people over 60 from this requirement. That being said, water bottles should not be present in Church – it’s Mass not a picnic.
- **Being Properly Disposed for Holy Communion.** When a Catholic approaches the altar for Holy Communion, Church law, buoyed by Holy Scripture, states that he may not be in a state of mortal sin (i.e. serious sin committed with full consent of the will, after sufficient reflection). In in mortal sin, one must receive absolution so he can properly and rightly receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Reception of the Eucharist, itself, absolves venial sins.

There are many other disciplines, customs and practices, but these which relate to Mass are always good to keep in our mind. And, let me add, that unlike wearing white only between Memorial Day and Labor Day, the practices related to Mass encompass the whole year – regardless of what Federal Holidays intervene.

**On the Dignity of Human Labor.** On this Labor Day weekend, let’s take a moment to pause, to reflect on, and to appreciate the achievement and innate dignity of the worker and his work, accomplished using his God-given talents. Pope John Paul II, in his 1987 encyclical, “*Laborem Exercens*” (On Human Labor), said it well: “[M]an’s life is built up every day from work; from work it derives its specific dignity... work is a fundamental dimension of man’s existence on earth.” He summed up his exhortation on labor by noting, “*All work, whether manual or intellectual, is inevitably linked with toil. The Christian finds in human work a small part of the Cross of Christ and accepts it in the same spirit of redemption in which Christ accepted His Cross for us.*”
